

Serafin Ensemble, "The Serafins," is a group of internationally acclaimed performing artists devoted to collaborative chamber music performances of unconducted repertoire. The ensemble performs great masterworks and lesser-known works for an unconducted ensemble of two to eight players. Occasionally, larger works or solo works are included in their programming.

The individual roster artists of Serafin Ensemble have been heralded around the globe for concerts and recordings, acclaimed in the press, and have received international prizes and awards. Their impressive affiliations and distinctions include: Steinway artist; Fulbright scholar; performances with Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Alexander, Attacca, Ciompi, Oxford, Serafin, and Vega String Quartets, "Alarm Will Sound", Boston Chamber Orchestra, I Musici de Montreal, Del'Arte Wind Quintet; prizes from the London String Quartet Competition and Concert Artists Guild; participation in summer programs such as Aspen, Aria, Banff, Brevard, Casals, Chatauqua, Ravinia, Spoleto, and Tanglewood; appearances on NPR's Performance Today, St. Paul Sunday Morning, WQXR, WRTI, Radio France, and National Radio of China; and degrees from major music schools including Juilliard, Peabody, Yale, Indiana, New England and Boston Conservatories, Royal Academy of Music, Mannes, Michigan, Eastman, and the Longy School.

Serafin's Naxos world premiere recording of works by Jennifer Higdon was listed among the "Top Ten Classical Albums in 2013" in Philadelphia's City Paper. New York Concert Review lauds the Serafin's live performances for "ensemble and intonation ... above reproach," and describes their Debussy as "a shapely, finely conceived account" and their Haydn as having "rhythmic vitality and taut ensemble..."

Serafin Presents is a non-profit organization that supports the performance and education outreach activities that **Serafin Ensemble** delivers. Serafin concerts feature roster artists and guest collaborators from around the world, and their outreach includes a partnership with Cab Calloway School of the Arts in Delaware, and "informance" and coaching sessions with various community, school, and college-level programs.

Serafin Ensemble takes its name from master violin maker, **Sanctus Serafin**, who in 1728 crafted the violin currently played by Serafin founder and artistic director, Kate Ransom.
